The Council Minutes from November 17, 2019

Basic Religious Beliefs Course at DHLC in January

Rev. Wally Mohr will teach a basic course in Christian Theology that he has taught several times at DHLC in the past. The course will present a brief view of various perspectives of religion and Christianity. This is not a "Lutheran" class but will present different perspectives on God, salvation, the writing and interpretation of Scripture, five various theological views on the atonement, early Christian heresies, various proofs for the existence of God, and understanding the reasons for different religions and denominations.

Wally will encourage the participants to examine their own religious views and the logical system of their religious views. For example, "Does my view of salvation and the process of salvation logically reflect my understanding of the nature of God?" And, "Can I differentiate between the simple teachings of Jesus and the church's complicated system of doctrine and dogma?"

The course will also discuss different views of God (Theism, Deism, Pantheism, Animism) and how our culture and our personal needs are often reflected in our religious or denominational choices (using Abraham Maslow's theory of the hierarchy of needs, as one tool.)

One class will examine the life and teachings of Jesus and raise questions about the differences between the religion of Jesus and the religion about Jesus. The closing session will examine how various Christian theological and denominational groups differ on some primary doctrinal issues.

The purpose of the class will not be to "argue" a particular view, but to understand various belief systems and then to examine our own theological perspectives and the consistency of our beliefs. There will be time in each session for questions and discussion.

The class will meet twice weekly in the Fellowship Hall on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from 1: p.m. – 2:30 p.m. for three weeks, beginning January 28 and going through February 13. Feel free to make as many classes as you can. Printed copies of the Power Point presentations will be available if a session is missed.

A brochure with a brief description of what will be covered is available on the table by the front desk (south entrance.)

Spiritual Practices for the New Year

Faith and Health are intrinsically connected. Cultivating our faith life is an important part of wellness. We are each created in the image of God with special gifts to share with others. Here are a few ways to gain new perspective of yourself, others and God in the New Year.

- 1) Pray at different times during the day. We pray differently at different times depending on what we are experiencing.
- 2) Laughter and rejoicing should be part of our faith life. Thanking God for giving us humor and finding laughter in something funny that happened lightens our mood.
- 3) Love yourself is the first step in "Love your neighbor as yourself." Remembering that God loves you and spending time writing about what it means to love yourself increases positive self-image, self-respect and that you are a healthy worthy human being.
- 4) We often neglect meditation or listening as part of our faith life. Take time to sit quietly, breathe, reflect and listen to your inner voice.
- 5) Remember that creation belongs to God and go for a prayerful walk. The air you breathe and the ground you walk on is the beauty of nature belonging to God.
- 6) Feel the brilliance in the way your body is created. Stretch out your arms, touch your toes, stretch your neck and pray a movement prayer.
- 7) At the end of the day, incorporate a list into prayer, of everything that you have encountered and are thankful for, including the challenges that helped you grow.


