





DHLC FOUNDATION INVESTS WITH ELCA FOUNDATION



Other than funds needed for short-term operational expenses, the Desert Hills Lutheran Church Foundation for the last four years has invested its funds with the ELCA Endowment Fund Pooled Trust [Fund A]. Administered by the ELCA Foundation, Fund A was established to allow for collective longterm investment of funds belonging to the ELCA, its congregations, synods, seminaries and other affiliated entities. Fund A's assets are selected in accordance with the ELCA's criteria of social responsibility. Approximately 60% of its investments are in U.S. and global equities, and the remainder of the funds are in bonds and fixed income investments. Since its inception Fund A has met or exceeded standard investment benchmarks.



Incorporating spiritual values into health education

PROTECTING THE DECEASED'S IDENTITY FROM ID THEFT

Identity theft has become a real and vicious crime. Each year nearly 800,000 of those deceased are deliberately targeted. The morbid fraudsters typically find potential targets by perusing obituary notices or graveyards. The identities are targeted for misuse on applications for credit products and cellphone services.

The information below provides a few tips and suggestions to reduce the risk of having a deceased person's identity stolen:

- Promptly notify the Social Security Administration of a loved one's death. A copy of the death certificate may also be sent with the decedent's final tax return.
- Notify all entities with which the deceased had a financial relationship including banks, credit card companies and brokerage firms about his or her death.
- Visit the DMV (Department of Motor Vehicles) and cancel driver's licenses or ID cards to prevent duplicates from being issued.
- Send the IRS a copy of the death certificate, this is used to flag the account to reflect that the person is deceased. A
 copy of the death certificate may also be sent with the decedent's final tax return.
- Notify all three credit reporting bureaus of the death Equifax, TransUnion and Experian and mail them copies
 of the death certificate.
- Avoid putting too much information in an obituary, such as birth date, address, mother's maiden name or other
 personally identifying information that could be useful to identity thieves. Resources: AARP Identity Theft
