

The DHLC Social Concerns Ministry will be holding a drive for needed items for the St. Andrew's Children's Clinic. The Clinic provides free, specialized medical care to 225-250 children monthly who are living in Mexico who cannot get the care or afford the care they need in their home country. The Clinic is held at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in Nogales, Arizona, and is staffed with volunteer professional healthcare personnel. Annually, 50-60 children have cleft palate/cleft lip surgery in Hermosillo, Sonora, Mexico. This special mission involves volunteers on both sides of the US-Mexico border who work with the medical team to give patients smiles and a much better life. To assist with that effort, donations for the drive can be made on the second, third and fourth weekends in January. Items needed by the clinic are: 6-packs of Pedi Sure, 6 pack small cans of prune juice, individual servings of dry milk (Walmart brand those items); new or gently used toys; coloring books and crayons; baby wipes, diapers (newborn thru size 6); children's vitamins; peanut butter; Walmart gift certificates, and cash for flights, transportation and

meals for families. Donation boxes will be set up in the halls of the church, the 2nd, 3rd & 4th weekends in January.
