Greetings Friends and Members of Desert Hills Lutheran,

In October I'll be offering a class about Bible Basics again. It will be held October 3, 17, 24, and 31 at 5:30 pm for one hour. Over the four weeks I'll cover the very

basic storyline of the Bible moving from Genesis to Revelation. This class is for beginners primarily but we never really become pros; God always continues to talk with us in His Word.

New Member classes begin on Thursday, October 11, at 9:30 am and 6:30 pm. This is our last offering of new member classes for 2018. If you have been contemplating joining Desert Hills, come and see.

Coming in November the 11:00 am service will have a change in music style. We know that 4% of American churches are growing and of that 4%, 80% of those growing churches use contemporary Christian music. Finally, there will be a teaser during the weekend services of October 20th and 21st about our Stewardship Campaign in November. It is based on another movie and I think we will have fun doing it. Our giving has grown in 2018 and I'm confident we can keep the generosity going.

The Social Concerns Committee will be sponsoring a drive for YOTO (Youth on Their Own) this October. This organization aids youth that have been abandoned and put out on the streets through no fault of their own. YOTO expects to serve 1700 students this school year. 30 students a day visit the mini mall. The mini mall is a place where students are allowed to visit once a week for basic needs such as food, toiletries, etc. The limit is 10 lbs. of food per individual plus one additional item such as shampoo, toothbrush, notebook, etc. We will be collecting non-perishable food items, personal care products, and undergarments for the mini mall along with \$25 gift cards and blankets for their Christmas drive. The drive will run from October 13 through October 28. You have 3 great weekends to donate to YOTO.

- 1. Fair Trade means fair pay and working conditions for farmers and producers. Fair Trade products are made in safe and healthy working conditions, where farmers and producers receive a fair price and have a voice in how their workplace is run.
- 2. Fair Trade is better for the environment. Fair Trade supports sustainable practices that minimize our environmental footprint.
- 3. Fair Trade means high quality goods. Artisans take pride in their work. Crafts are often handmade, which translates into closer attention to detail and in the end higher-quality products.
- 4. Fair Trade means better tasting food. Farmers are involved and invested in the entire production process, and crops are grown and harvested in smaller quantities. As a result, Fair Trade food is fresher and tastier.
- 5. Fair Trade is safe. Fair Trade actively promotes integrated farm management systems that improve soil fertility and preserve valuable ecosystems, and limit the use of harmful agrochemicals that present dangers to farmers' health. That means food that's safer for you and for the people who grow it.


