

Incorporating spiritual values into health education

The **Holidays** are here: Nothing says holiday party like your favorite comfort foods such as cheesy dips to decadent desserts. There's a lot to love about the relaxed, cozy-casual, and friendly atmosphere of a great potluck, whether you're hosting or attending. It's tempting to overload plates with high-calorie treats. Stay healthy and mindful as you celebrate the holidays with friends and family. You can eat well and be well this holiday season by following these simple strategies. So, bring on the all-together-now potluck parties and "Deck the Halls", but don't ditch your diet!

Enjoy in moderation.

Enjoy holiday treats in smaller portions, make healthy substitutions where you can, and plan ahead for merry meals that are healthy, too.

Plan for colorful plates.

You decorate for the holidays with a lot of color, treat your plate the same way. Seasonal, colorful fruits and vegetables will add flavor, color and nutrients to holiday favorites. Choose veggies such as beans, broccoli, or mixed greens and fruit with berries or grapes. They help you feel fuller longer so you can avoid the temptation to overeat. Save calories with smaller helpings.

Slash unwanted calories with easy swaps and substitutions.

Christian Churches are faced with a growing problem. Our Lutheran Church is experiencing the same difficulty. We are facing a future with a severe shortage of pastoral leadership for parish ministry. It has been estimated that soon there could be as many as 1000 unfilled pastoral positions in the ELCA. Of course we pray that God's call to ministry will reach the hearts of more of our members as the future unfolds. However, the annual cost of educating a seminary student now exceeds \$30,000. Very few if any of these students can afford this on their own. There are steps that we can take to make recruitment of future pastors more attractive.

Our Desert Hills Lutheran Foundation has taken this problem very seriously and is taking steps to alleviate the problem. First, our Board of Directors has made a commitment to allocate half of our

annual budget for grants for seminary student scholarships. We are thankful that over the last three years we have been able to assist five future pastors with scholarship support. The other half of our budget is used for other church projects and local service agencies. Second, we have established the Rev. Martin Overson fund for the development of Christian leadership. We are thankful that over the last three years we have been able to assist ten young non clergy individuals involved in mission projects.

Our dream is to do more. Even though we cannot solve the entire problem we want to do what we can for the future proclamation of the Gospel from the pulpits of our congregations.
